The Courthouse parking lots are coming near to completion. They are working with the IT Department to start the camera project at the Jail this week. County Engineer's Office Manager Becky Purchase reported the contractors are pouring concrete on the Bridgeport Rd. project. County Treasurer Janelle Nalley-Londquist stated her office is busy. SEIL CDS Director Ken Hyndman reported he attended SEIL meetings last week and they are working on putting together a mobile crisis unit for our area. They are working on getting contracts approved. County Recorder Natalie Steffener reported her office was open Saturday for passports and they had a good turnout. Her office remains busy. County Attorney Lisa Schaefer reported her office is busy. Birgit Brissey, who has been with Des Moines County for almost 27 years, is retiring at the end of this month. Lisa would like to thank Birgit for her dedication to her department and wishes her the best in retirement. Sheriff Kevin Glendening reported his office conducted their action report on the tornado in Mediapolis. His Deputies went through ways of improving should there ever be an event like this in the future. The Civil Service will conduct interviews this Thursday for a new Deputy. The jail population is 74. IT Direction Colin Gerst stated his office remains busy. Assistant Land Use Administrator Jarred Lassiter stated the office has several subdivisions in the works. Budget Director Cheryl McVey is present for an agenda item. Conservation Director Chris Lee reported summer camp sign up will start next Tuesday at noon. The parks have been very busy and Big Hollow has had several campers. County Auditor Sara Doty reported her office is busy.
